## Llynfie Court

Situated in Maesteg, South Wales this luxury private development has been designed and built by the owner who is a local housing developer. It is a large five bedroom detached property that is perched on the side of a hill overlooking a valley.

Many of his ideas were incorporated in to the design including the large curved walls on the South and West facing elevations.
